

Woodcraft of Iowa City's new store expansion is nearly ready. They have hired an education manager, Hunter Menken, to coordinate instructors for classes. They would like to have regular "Turning Tuesday' classes. This is a great opportunity for our club members to teach the next generation. Hunter is actively seeking instructors to teach all levels. It is hoped that for these first two months, most of the turning would be beginner - intermediate, but exceptions can be made. As far as payment goes, the instructors will get 50% of the tuition. They choose the price of the class and Hunter can walk them through how he goes about pricing his own courses. He'd also need some kind of description of what they'd like to teach so that he can post that on their website. All of these items will be worked out between him and the individual instructors.

# **Dues Structure and Meeting Attendance Policy**

Club dues are:

\$25.00 per year for an General membership.

\$30.00 per year for a Family membership

\$100.00 per year for a Supporting membership.

Dues are for the calendar year January 1 thru December 31 with a grace period ending at the close of the February meeting. New membership cards will be distributed at the March meeting.
